Savoring Sevva

CHINA Hong Kong has had an abundance of high-glamour places in which to dine among the stars but never in which to gaze at them from below—until local jet-setter Bonnie Gokson unveiled **Sevva** (pronounced “savor”) last year. Enshrined on the stylish top floor of the upscale Prince’s Building shopping plaza, in the middle of the Central district, Sevva overlooks the colonial city hall and hovers at eye level with the skyline’s most iconic towers (they’re so close, you can spy employees at work in the ninety-story glass buildings). Designed by Calvin Tsao, the 22,000-square-foot space references the golden age of Hong Kong with massive chandeliers and bold artwork throughout. Gokson’s idea is to offer several restaurants in one: choose a Harbourside table for healthful and light dishes, Bankside for a power lunch or Taste Bar for tapas and wine, among others. Whatever your pleasure, be sure to request a seat on a terrace—at this Hong Kong hot spot the action happens outdoors, with live music wafting in the breeze and stargazing, both human and extraterrestrial, taking place all night long. 011-852-2537-1388; sevvahk.com.
